The Prayer of Hannah (Samuel's Mother)

- He raiseth up the poor out of the dust, and lifteth up the beggar from the dunghill, to set them among princes, and to make them inherit the throne of glory: for the pillars of the earth are YHWH's, and he hath set the world upon them.
- He will keep the feet of his saints, and the wicked shall be silent in darkness; for by strength shall no man prevail.
- The adversaries of YHWH shall be broken to pieces; out of heaven shall he thunder upon them: YHWH shall judge the ends of the earth; and he shall give strength unto his king, and exalt the horn of his anointed.
- And Elkanah went to Ramah to his house. And the child did minister unto YHWH before Eli the priest. (I Samuel 2:8-11)

Samuel Watches the Corruption of the House of Eli

- Unlike the other Messiahs we will study, Samuel was never anointed by any man.
- The High Priest Eli was a studied man, but he did NOT attend to the affairs of his family.
- When Samuel was young, the sons of Eli ran the tabernacle and ran it corruptly.
- Now the sons of Eli were sons of Belial; they knew not YHWH.
(I Samuel 2:12)
 - A True Messianic Figure is willing to WAIT until the anti-messiah figure meets his demise before he takes over.
 - An Anti-Messiah will think nothing of taking over for another Anti-Messiah.

The Corruption of the House of Eli

- And the priests' custom with the people was, that, when any man offered sacrifice, the priest's servant came, while the flesh was in seething, with a fleshhook of three teeth in his hand;
- And he struck it into the pan, or kettle, or caldron, or pot; all that the fleshhook brought up the priest took for himself. So they did in Shiloh unto all the Israelites that came thither.
- Also before they burnt the fat, the priest's servant came, and said to the man that sacrificed, Give flesh to roast for the priest; for he will not have sodden flesh of thee, but raw. (I Samuel 2:13-15)
 - Samuel was willing to wait around while seeing these gross violations of the Torah.

The Corruption of the House of Eli

- And if any man said unto him, Let them not fail to burn the fat presently, and then take as much as thy soul desireth; then he would answer him, Nay; but thou shalt give it me now: and if not, I will take it by force.
- Wherefore the sin of the young men was very great before YHWH: for men abhorred the offering of YHWH.
- But Samuel ministered before YHWH, being a child, girded with a linen ephod. (I Samuel 2:16-18)
 - The priests became abusive to the people, demanding that they not take home the burnt offering as the Torah commanded.
 - The people began to hate the entire system.
 - Samuel bided his time, waiting before YHWH.

The Corruption of the House of Eli

- Moreover his mother made him a little coat, and brought it to him from year to year, when she came up with her husband to offer the yearly sacrifice.
- And Eli blessed Elkanah and his wife, and said, YHWH give thee seed of this woman for the loan which is lent to YHWH. And they went unto their own home.
- And YHWH visited Hannah, so that she conceived, and bare three sons and two daughters. And the child Samuel grew before YHWH. (I Samuel 2:19-21)
 - Most people do not realize that Samuel had three brothers and two sisters.
 - They were given to Hannah because she gave Samuel to YHWH.

The Corruption of the House of Eli

- Now Eli was very old, and heard all that his sons did unto all Israel; and how they lay with the women that assembled at the door of the tabernacle of the congregation.
- And he said unto them, Why do ye such things? for I hear of your evil dealings by all this people.
- Nay, my sons; for it is no good report that I hear: ye make YHWH's people to transgress.
- If one man sin against another, the judge shall judge him: but if a man sin against YHWH, who shall intreat for him?
- Notwithstanding they hearkened not unto the voice of their father, because YHWH would slay them.
- And the child Samuel grew on, and was in favour both with YHWH, and also with men. (I Samuel 2:22-26)

The Corruption of the House of Eli

- Samuel's sons took advantage of the women that assembled at the door of the tabernacle.
- When Eli confronted them about their behavior, they did not take him seriously. They realized that they were headed for disaster. Why?
 - They had become Sons of Belial!
 - They had also built a temple in Shiloh... without authorization. (I Samuel 1:9, 3:3)
 - Beware when preachers claim, "God told me to build a building."
 - If YHWH wants a building built, He will pay for it, HIMSELF!
- Samuel continued to bide his time.

An Unnamed Prophet Visits Eli

- And there came a man of Elohim unto Eli, and said unto him, Thus saith YHWH, Did I plainly appear unto the house of thy father, when they were in Egypt in Pharaoh's house? (Clearly, the prophet is referring to Aaron and his sons.)
- And did I choose him out of all the tribes of Israel to be my priest, to offer upon mine altar, to burn incense, to wear an ephod before me? and did I give unto the house of thy father all the offerings made by fire of the children of Israel?
- Wherefore kick ye at my sacrifice and at mine offering, which I have commanded in my habitation; and honourest thy sons above me, to make yourselves fat with the chiefest of all the offerings of Israel my people? (I Samuel 2:27-29)
 - They did not take their duties seriously. Judaism was a business for them.
 - They made it a profit-making venture!
 - For all anti-messiahs, it is all about the money.

An Unnamed Prophet Visits Eli

- Wherefore YHWH Elohim of Israel saith, I said indeed that thy house, and the house of thy father, should walk before me for ever: but now YHWH saith, Be it far from me; for them that honour me I will honour, and they that despise me shall be lightly esteemed.
- Behold, the days come, that I will cut off thine arm, and the arm of thy father's house, that there shall not be an old man in thine house.
- And thou shalt see an enemy in my habitation, in all the wealth which Elohim shall give Israel: and there shall not be an old man in thine house for ever. (I Samuel 2:30-32)
 - The anti-messiah will suffer a curse all their days.
 - Very few of them will get old. The pressures of keeping up a business without the blessing of the Heavenly Father destroys the anti-messiah.
 - Those that do get old, do so because they sold their souls to Ancient Evil.

An Unnamed Prophet Visits Eli

- And the man of thine, whom I shall not cut off from mine altar, shall be to consume thine eyes, and to grieve thine heart: and all the increase of thine house shall die in the flower of their age.
- And this shall be a sign unto thee, that shall come upon thy two sons, on Hophni and Phinehas; in one day they shall die both of them. (I Samuel 2:33-34)
 - YHWH still honors Aaron by letting his descendants serve in the tabernacle, but those who attend that tabernacle will suffer these curses:
 - 1) Spiritual Blindness (their eyes will be blind spiritually).
 - 2) Sadness – Serving YHWH will not be pleasant.
 - 3) Financial problems as they get older.
 - When an unproven prophet gives a prophecy (the text does not even give us his name!) that concerns long-term events, they need to add a tag on that prophecy that is short-term so that people will know the prophecy is from YHWH.

An Unnamed Prophet Visits Eli

- And I will raise me up a faithful priest, that shall do according to that which is in mine heart and in my mind: and I will build him a sure house; and he shall walk before mine anointed for ever.
- And it shall come to pass, that every one that is left in thine house shall come and crouch to him for a piece of silver and a morsel of bread, and shall say, Put me, I pray thee, into one of the priests' offices, that I may eat a piece of bread. (I Samuel 2:35-36)
 - The second tag of short-term fulfillment is the rise of Samuel, who would become the only Israelite judge, priest, and prophet. No other man filled all three roles.
 - Reading this prophecy, one wonders if he was the primary ancestor of the House of Zadok?
 - The House of Eli will always attempt to usurp the authority of the House of Zadok.

The Curse of the House of Eli

- The House of Eli will suffer a curse.
- The proof of this curse will be the death of Eli's sons in one day.
- Eventually, they will never serve in the Tabernacle! (See the Book of Ezekiel)
- Instead, they will set up a fake system of worship for Ancient Evil in:
 - Phoenicia
 - Babylon
 - Greece
 - Rome
- They will be the high priests that serve in Herod's Temple.
- When Judaism becomes unpopular, they become Christians and create the Roman Catholic Church... and her Protestant Daughters!

YHWH calls Samuel to Ministry

- And the child Samuel ministered unto YHWH before Eli. And the word of YHWH was precious in those days; there was no open vision.
- And it came to pass at that time, when Eli was laid down in his place, and his eyes began to wax dim, that he could not see;
- And ere the lamp of Elohim went out in the temple of YHWH, where the ark of Elohim was, and Samuel was laid down to sleep;
- That YHWH called Samuel: and he answered, Here am I. (I Samuel 3:1-4)
 - It would take three times before Eli realized that Samuel would be the next prophet in Israel.
 - Eli told Samuel how to answer when YHWH calls.

YHWH calls Samuel to Ministry

- And YHWH came, and stood, and called as at other times, Samuel, Samuel. Then Samuel answered, Speak; for thy servant heareth.
- And YHWH said to Samuel, Behold, I will do a thing in Israel, at which both the ears of every one that heareth it shall tingle.
- In that day I will perform against Eli all things which I have spoken concerning his house: when I begin, I will also make an end.
- For I have told him (Eli) that I will judge his house for ever for the iniquity which he knoweth; because his sons made themselves vile, and he restrained them not. (I Samuel 3:10-13)

YHWH calls Samuel to Ministry

- And therefore I have sworn unto the house of Eli, that the iniquity of Eli's house shall not be purged with sacrifice nor offering for ever.
- And Samuel lay until the morning, and opened the doors of the house of YHWH. And Samuel feared to shew Eli the vision.
- Then Eli called Samuel, and said, Samuel, my son. And he answered, Here am I. And he said,
- What is the thing that YHWH hath said unto thee? I pray thee hide it not from me: Elohim do so to thee, and more also, if thou hide any thing from me of all the things that he said unto thee. (I Samuel 3:14-17)

YHWH calls Samuel to Ministry

- And Samuel told him every whit, and hid nothing from him. And he said, It is YHWH: let him do what seemeth him good.
- And Samuel grew, and YHWH was with him, and did let none of his words fall to the ground.
- And all Israel from Dan even to Beer-sheba knew that Samuel was established to be a prophet of YHWH.
- And YHWH appeared again in Shiloh: for YHWH revealed himself to Samuel in Shiloh by the word of YHWH. (I Samuel 3:18-21)

The End of the House of Eli

- And the word of Samuel came to all Israel. Now Israel went out against the Philistines to battle, and pitched beside Eben-ezer: and the Philistines pitched in Aphek.
- And the Philistines put themselves in array against Israel: and when they joined battle, Israel was smitten before the Philistines: and they slew of the army in the field about four thousand men.
- And when the people were come into the camp, the elders of Israel said, Wherefore hath YHWH smitten us to day before the Philistines? Let us fetch the ark of the covenant of YHWH out of Shiloh unto us, that, when it cometh among us, it may save us out of the hand of our enemies. (I Samuel 4:1-3)

The End of the House of Eli

- So the people sent to Shiloh, that they might bring from thence the ark of the covenant of YHWH of hosts, which dwelleth between the cherubims: and the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, were there with the ark of the covenant of Elohim.
- And when the ark of the covenant of YHWH came into the camp, all Israel shouted with a great shout, so that the earth rang again.
- And when the Philistines heard the noise of the shout, they said, What meaneth the noise of this great shout in the camp of the Hebrews? And they understood that the ark of YHWH was come into the camp. (I Samuel 4:4-6)

The End of the House of Eli

- And the Philistines were afraid, for they said, Elohim is come into the camp. And they said, Woe unto us! for there hath not been such a thing heretofore.
- Woe unto us! who shall deliver us out of the hand of these mighty Elohims? these are the Elohims that smote the Egyptians with all the plagues in the wilderness.
- Be strong, and quit yourselves like men, O ye Philistines, that ye be not servants unto the Hebrews, as they have been to you: quit yourselves like men, and fight. (I Samuel 4:7-9)

The End of the House of Eli

- And the Philistines fought, and Israel was smitten, and they fled every man into his tent: and there was a very great slaughter; for there fell of Israel thirty thousand footmen.
- And the ark of Elohim was taken; and the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, were slain.
- And there ran a man of Benjamin out of the army, and came to Shiloh the same day with his clothes rent, and with earth upon his head. (I Samuel 4:10-12)
 - We see the unnamed prophet's prophecy has been fulfilled on one account. Eli's sons were killed in battle.
 - The Ark of the Covenant was taken by the Philistines, effectively ending the reign of Eli's sons over Israel.

The End of the House of Eli

- And when he came, lo, Eli sat upon a seat by the wayside watching: for his heart trembled for the ark of Elohim. And when the man came into the city, and told it, all the city cried out.
- And when Eli heard the noise of the crying, he said, What meaneth the noise of this tumult? And the man came in hastily, and told Eli.
- Now Eli was ninety and eight years old (98); and his eyes were dim, that he could not see. (I Samuel 4:13-15)
 - When a country lost 30,000 men in one day, everyone is likely to have lost someone.

The End of the House of Eli

- And the man said unto Eli, I am he that came out of the army, and I fled to day out of the army. And he said, What is there done, my son?
- And the messenger answered and said, Israel is fled before the Philistines, and there hath been also a great slaughter among the people, and thy two sons also, Hophni and Phinehas, are dead, and the ark of Elohim is taken.
- And it came to pass, when he made mention of the ark of Elohim, that he fell from off the seat backward by the side of the gate, and his neck brake, and he died: for he was an old man, and heavy. And he had judged Israel forty years. (I Samuel 4:16-18)

The End of the House of Eli

- And his daughter in law, Phinehas' wife, was with child, near to be delivered: and when she heard the tidings that the ark of Elohim was taken, and that her father in law and her husband were dead, she bowed herself and travailed; for her pains came upon her.
- And about the time of her death the women that stood by her said unto her, Fear not; for thou hast born a son. But she answered not, neither did she regard it.
- And she named the child I-chabod, saying, The glory is departed from Israel: because the ark of Elohim was taken, and because of her father in law and her husband.
- And she said, The glory is departed from Israel: for the ark of Elohim is taken. (I Samuel 4:19-22)
 - Eli = “ascension”
 - Samuel = “His name is El”
 - Ichabod = “no glory”

Samuel Becomes Judge Over Israel

- And Samuel spake unto all the house of Israel, saying, If ye do return unto YHWH with all your hearts, then put away the strange elohim and Ashtaroth from among you, and prepare your hearts unto YHWH, and serve him only: and he will deliver you out of the hand of the Philistines.
- Then the children of Israel did put away Baalim and Ashtaroth, and served YHWH only.
- And Samuel said, Gather all Israel to Mizpeh, and I will pray for you unto YHWH. (I Samuel 7:3-5)
 - Samuel explained to the children of Israel that unless they served YHWH only, they would never defeat the Philistines.
 - The people complied and got rid of their idols. Until the United States does this, they will never be victorious either.
 - When YHWH speaks a word, it is for all time!
- Yahushua the Messiah the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever. (Hebrews 13:8)

Samuel Becomes Judge Over Israel

- And they gathered together to Mizpeh, and drew water, and poured it out before YHWH, and fasted on that day, and said there, We have sinned against YHWH. And Samuel judged the children of Israel in Mizpeh.
- And when the Philistines heard that the children of Israel were gathered together to Mizpeh, the rulers of the Philistines went up against Israel. And when the children of Israel heard it, they were afraid of the Philistines.
- And the children of Israel said to Samuel, Cease not to cry unto YHWH our Elohim for us, that he will save us out of the hand of the Philistines. (I Samuel 7:6-8)

Samuel Becomes Judge Over Israel

- And Samuel took a sucking lamb, and offered it for a burnt offering wholly unto YHWH: and Samuel cried unto YHWH for Israel; and YHWH heard him.
- And as Samuel was offering up the burnt offering, the Philistines drew near to battle against Israel: but YHWH thundered with a great thunder on that day upon the Philistines, and discomfited them; and they were smitten before Israel.
- And the men of Israel went out of Mizpeh, and pursued the Philistines, and smote them, until they came under Beth-car. (I Samuel 7:9-11)
 - Scholars are not in agreement with where Bethcar is. (**בֵּית כֶּר**) Value = 632 = Psalms 134:

Behold, bless ye YHWH, all ye servants of YHWH, which by night stand in the house of YHWH. Lift up your hands in the sanctuary, and bless YHWH. YHWH that made heaven and earth bless thee out of Zion. (Psalms 134:1-3)

Samuel Becomes Judge Over Israel

- Then Samuel took a stone, and set it between Mizpeh and Shen, and called the name of it Eben-ezer, saying, Hitherto hath YHWH helped us.
- So the Philistines were subdued, and they came no more into the coast of Israel: and the hand of YHWH was against the Philistines all the days of Samuel. And the cities which the Philistines had taken from Israel were restored to Israel, from Ekron even unto Gath; and the coasts thereof did Israel deliver out of the hands of the Philistines.
- And there was peace between Israel and the Amorites. (I Samuel 7:12-14)
 - Eben-ezer = “Stone of help” = 418 = Nehemiah 5:
 - Yea, also I continued in the work of this wall, neither bought we any land: and all my servants were gathered thither unto the work. (Nehemiah 5:16)

Samuel Becomes Judge Over Israel

- And Samuel judged Israel all the days of his life.
- And he went from year to year in circuit to Bethel, and Gilgal, and Mizpeh, and judged Israel in all those places.
- And his return was to Ramah; for there was his house; and there he judged Israel; and there he built an altar unto YHWH. (I Samuel 7:15-17)
 - Ramah = “Hill” = (**רָמָה**) = 245 = I Samuel 9:
 - Then said Saul to his servant, Well said; come, let us go. So they went unto the city where the man of Elohim was. And as they went up the hill to the city, they found young maidens going out to draw water, and said unto them, Is the seer here? (I Samuel 9:10-11)

Israel Demands a King!

- And it came to pass, when Samuel was old, that he made his sons judges over Israel.
- Now the name of his firstborn was Joel; and the name of his second, Abiah: they were judges in Beer-sheba.
- And his sons walked not in his ways, but turned aside after lucre, and took bribes, and perverted judgment. (I Samuel 8:1-3)

Israel Demands a King!

- Then all the elders of Israel gathered themselves together, and came to Samuel unto Ramah,
- And said unto him, Behold, thou art old, and thy sons walk not in thy ways: now make us a king to judge us like all the nations.
- But the thing displeased Samuel, when they said, Give us a king to judge us. And Samuel prayed unto YHWH. (I Samuel 8:4-6)

Israel Demands a King!

- And YHWH said unto Samuel, Hearken unto the voice of the people in all that they say unto thee: for they have not rejected thee, but they have rejected me, that I should not reign over them.
- According to all the works which they have done since the day that I brought them up out of Egypt even unto this day, wherewith they have forsaken me, and served other elohim, so do they also unto thee.
- Now therefore hearken unto their voice:
 - 1) howbeit yet protest solemnly unto them, and
 - 2) shew them the manner of the king that shall reign over them. (I Samuel 8:7-9)

Samuel Tells the People What a King Will Require:

- And Samuel told all the words of YHWH unto the people that asked of him a king.
- And he said, This will be the manner of the king that shall reign over you: He will take your sons, and appoint them for himself, for his chariots, and to be his horsemen; and some shall run before his chariots.
- And he will appoint him captains over thousands, and captains over fifties; and will set them to ear his ground, and to reap his harvest, and to make his instruments of war, and instruments of his chariots.
- And he will take your daughters to be confectionaries, and to be cooks, and to be bakers.
(I Samuel 8:10-13)

Samuel Tells the People What a King Will Require:

- And he will take your fields, and your vineyards, and your oliveyards, even the best of them, and give them to his servants.
- And he will take the tenth of your seed, and of your vineyards, and give to his officers, and to his servants.
- And he will take your menservants, and your maidservants, and your goodliest young men, and your asses, and put them to his work.
- He will take the tenth of your sheep: and ye shall be his servants.
- And ye shall cry out in that day because of your king which ye shall have chosen you; and YHWH will not hear you in that day. (I Samuel 8:14-18)

Israel Rejects their Messiah... Chooses a King Instead!

- Nevertheless the people refused to obey the voice of Samuel; and they said, Nay; but we will have a king over us;
- That we also may be like all the nations; and that our king may judge us, and go out before us, and fight our battles.
- And Samuel heard all the words of the people, and he rehearsed them in the ears of YHWH.
- And YHWH said to Samuel, Hearken unto their voice, and make them a king. And Samuel said unto the men of Israel, Go ye every man unto his city. (1 Samuel 8:19-22)

Israel Rejects their Messiah... Chooses a King Instead!

- Now YHWH had told Samuel in his ear a day before Saul came, saying,
- To morrow about this time I will send thee a man out of the land of Benjamin, and thou shalt anoint him to be captain over my people Israel, that he may save my people out of the hand of the Philistines: for I have looked upon my people, because their cry is come unto me.
- And when Samuel saw Saul, YHWH said unto him, Behold the man whom I spake to thee of! this same shall reign over my people. (I Samuel 9:15-17)

Israel Rejects their Messiah... Chooses a King Instead!

- Then Samuel took a vial of oil, and poured it upon his head, and kissed him, and said, Is it not because YHWH hath anointed thee to be captain over his inheritance?
- When thou art departed from me to day, then thou shalt find two men by Rachel's sepulchre in the border of Benjamin at Zelzah; and they will say unto thee, The asses which thou wentest to seek are found: and, lo, thy father hath left the care of the asses, and sorroweth for you, saying, What shall I do for my son?
- Then shalt thou go on forward from thence, and thou shalt come to the plain of Tabor, and there shall meet thee three men going up to Elohim to Bethel, one carrying three kids, and another carrying three loaves of bread, and another carrying a bottle of wine:
- And they will salute thee, and give thee two loaves of bread; which thou shalt receive of their hands. (I Samuel 10:1-4)

Israel Rejects their Messiah... Chooses a King Instead!

- After that thou shalt come to the hill of Elohim, where is the garrison of the Philistines: and it shall come to pass, when thou art come thither to the city, that thou shalt meet a company of prophets coming down from the high place with a psaltery, and a tabret, and a pipe, and a harp, before them; and they shall prophesy:
- And the Spirit of YHWH will come upon thee, and thou shalt prophesy with them, and shalt be turned into another man.
- And let it be, when these signs are come unto thee, that thou do as occasion serve thee; for Elohim is with thee. (I Samuel 10:5-7)

Israel Rejects their Messiah... Chooses a King Instead!

- And thou shalt go down before me to Gilgal; and, behold, I will come down unto thee, to offer burnt offerings, and to sacrifice sacrifices of peace offerings: seven days shalt thou tarry, till I come to thee, and shew thee what thou shalt do.
- And it was so, that when he had turned his back to go from Samuel, Elohim gave him another heart: and all those signs came to pass that day.
- And when they came thither to the hill, behold, a company of prophets met him; and the Spirit of Elohim came upon him, and he prophesied among them.
- And it came to pass, when all that knew him beforetime saw that, behold, he prophesied among the prophets, then the people said one to another, What is this that is come unto the son of Kish? Is Saul also among the prophets? (1 Samuel 10:8-11)

The Unique Status of Samuel

- A Judge in Israel!
- One of Israel's greatest prophets!
 - Under his leadership, the Band of Prophets was formed. Some people who were part of this Band were:
 - Samuel
 - Amos
 - Saul (at times)
 - Isaiah
 - Elijah
 - Jeremiah
 - Elisha
 - Likely many of the other minor prophets

Word Study on the Hebrew Word *Meshiyach* (Messiah)

- After Samuel, a prophet and the last good Judge of Israel selected a King of Israel, he made this statement:
 - And now, behold, the king walketh before you: and I am old and grayheaded; and, behold, my sons are with you: and I have walked before you from my childhood unto this day.
 - Behold, here I am: witness against me before YHWH, and before his anointed (Messiah): whose ox have I taken? or whose ass have I taken? or whom have I defrauded? whom have I oppressed? or of whose hand have I received any bribe to blind mine eyes therewith? and I will restore it you.
 - And they said, Thou hast not defrauded us, nor oppressed us, neither hast thou taken ought of any man's hand.
 - And he said unto them, YHWH is witness against you, and his anointed is witness this day, that ye have not found ought in my hand. And they answered, He is witness. (I Samuel 12:2-5)

Samuel Selects Israel's Next Messiah

- And YHWH said unto Samuel, How long wilt thou mourn for Saul, seeing I have rejected him from reigning over Israel? fill thine horn with oil, and go, I will send thee to Jesse the Bethlehemite: for I have provided me a king among his sons.
- And Samuel said, How can I go? if Saul hear it, he Will kill me. And YHWH said, Take an heifer with thee, and say, I am come to sacrifice to YHWH.
- And call Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will shew thee what thou shalt do: and thou shalt anoint unto me him whom I name unto thee.
- And Samuel did that which YHWH spake, and came to Bethlehem. And the elders of the town trembled at his coming, and said, Comest thou peaceably? (I Samuel 16:1-4)

Samuel Selects Israel's Next Messiah

- And he said, Peaceably: I am come to sacrifice unto YHWH: sanctify yourselves, and come with me to the sacrifice.
- And he sanctified Jesse and his sons, and called them to the sacrifice. And it came to pass, when they were come, that he looked on Eliab, and said, Surely YHWH's anointed is before him.
- But YHWH said unto Samuel, Look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because I have refused him: for YHWH seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but YHWH looketh on the heart.
- Then Jesse called Abinadab, and made him pass before Samuel. And he said, Neither hath YHWH chosen this. (I Samuel 16:5-8)

- Then Jesse made Shammah to pass by. And he said, Neither hath YHWH chosen this.
- Again, Jesse made seven of his sons to pass before Samuel. And Samuel said unto Jesse, YHWH hath not chosen these.
- And Samuel said unto Jesse, Are here all thy children? And he said, There remaineth yet the youngest, and, behold, he keepeth the sheep. And Samuel said unto Jesse, Send and fetch him: for we will not sit down till he come hither.
- And he sent, and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, and withal of a beautiful countenance, and goodly to look to. And YHWH said, Arise, anoint him: for this is he.
- Then Samuel took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the midst of his brethren: and the Spirit of YHWH came upon David from that day forward. So Samuel rose up, and went to Ramah. (I Samuel 16:9-13)

- Again, Jesse made seven of his sons to pass before Samuel. And Samuel said unto Jesse, YHWH hath not chosen these.
- And Samuel said unto Jesse, Are here all thy children? And he said, There remaineth yet the youngest, and, behold, he keepeth the sheep. And Samuel said unto Jesse, Send and fetch him: for we will not sit down till he come hither.
- And he sent, and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, and withal of a beautiful countenance, and goodly to look to. And YHWH said, Arise, anoint him: for this is he.
- Then Samuel took the horn of oil, and anointed him in the midst of his brethren: and the Spirit of YHWH came upon David from that day forward. So Samuel rose up, and went to Ramah. (I Samuel 16:9-13)

Samuel Dies, but is Wrongly Wakened by King Saul

- And Samuel died; and all the Israelites were gathered together, and lameinted him, and buried him in his house at Ramah. And David arose, and went down to the wilderness of Paran. (I Samuel 25:1)
- And he said unto her, What form is he of? And she said, An old man cometh up; and he is covered with a mantle. And Saul perceived that it was Samuel, and he stooped with his face to the ground, and bowed himself.
- And Samuel said to Saul, Why hast thou disquieted me, to bring me up? And Saul answered, I am sore distressed; for the Philistines make war against me, and Elohim is departed from me, and answereth me no more, neither by prophets, nor by dreams: therefore I have called thee, that thou mayest make known unto me what I shall do.
- Then said Samuel, Wherefore then dost thou ask of me, seeing YHWH is departed from thee, and is become thine enemy? (I Samuel 28:14-16)

Samuel Dies, but is Wrongly Wakened by King Saul

- And YHWH hath done to him, as he spake by me: for YHWH hath rent the kingdom out of thine hand, and given it to thy neighbour, even to David:
- Because thou obeyedst not the voice of YHWH, nor executedst his fierce wrath upon Amalek, therefore hath YHWH done this thing unto thee this day.
- Moreover YHWH will also deliver Israel with thee into the hand of the Philistines: and to morrow shalt thou and thy sons be with me: YHWH also shall deliver the host of Israel into the hand of the Philistines.
- Then Saul fell straightway all along on the earth, and was sore afraid, because of the words of Samuel: and there was no strength in him; for he had eaten no bread all the day, nor all the night. (I Samuel 28:17-20)
